Intern files to impeach ASUO Executive

A formal grievance filed Monday afternoon demands the impeachment of the ASUO president and vice president. The grievance, signed by Scott Austin, ASUO vice president, charges professional negligence, false advertising, Austin works as an ASUO intern. He disagreed with how the ASUO used the Constitution Court. The ASUO advertised the position and then appointed
