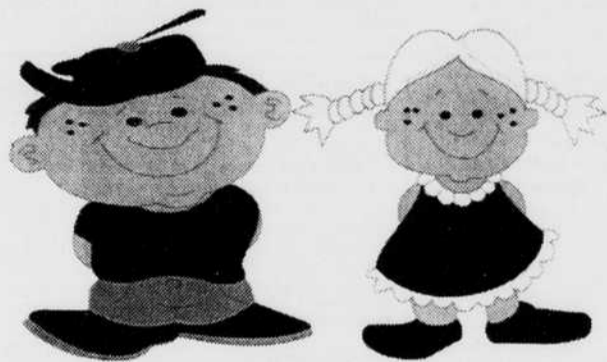

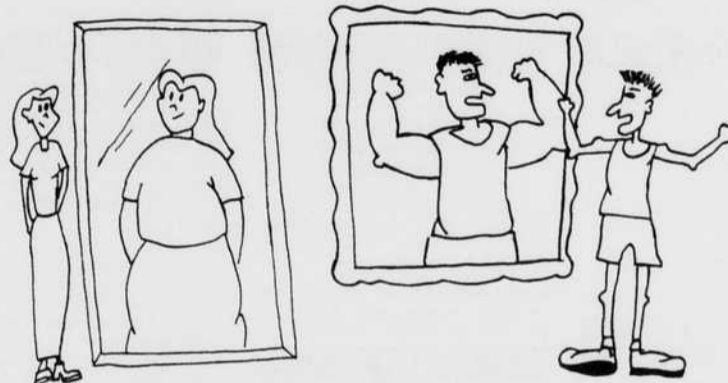
Resiliency
