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ASUO: Miner to ask for more time

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never seen a formal extension of the budget deadline.

But the ASUO wanted enough time to handle the grievances carefully and responsibly, Miner said.

Those concerns have taken on more importance because the Oregon Legislature is considering bills that would limit students' ability to set their incidental fees. The ASUO must show it can govern itself without state interference, Miner explained.

"It will show that students can be accountable to themselves," Student Senate President Michelle Johnston said. "To go with an uncertain number would show that we can't deal with these problems, that the procedures are very loose."

The ASUO still might have

trouble taking care of the grievances, even with the extension, Johnston said.

The Constitution Court could order a special election; but the new deadline falls just two days after the court could make that decision. The ASUO would have to compress an entire election into little more than 24 hours.

Miner plans to ask the Oregon University System for another extension, either until May 18 or 22. That would give the ASUO enough of a time cushion in case the court orders another election.

The Oregon University System has scheduled a public hearing on the budget for June 5, Stubbart said. It needs to have all budgetary information finalized and compiled before then.

But the University system schedules extra time into its time line. Stubbart said he could probably approve another extension, although he had not seen a formal request Monday afternoon.

"I don't have a strict legal deadline that this is conflicting with," he said. "I think I can accommodate that without too much difficulty."
