Fourth-year head coach Ben Clegg said his team took its travel frustration out on California University.

The Ducks went out in front 10-5 in the fast-paced first half. The Pennsylvania team couldn't handle game MVP Erik East, as the 300-pound prop ran two second-half tries up the middle of the field, dragging California University players with him.

East's play put the game out of reach, 22-16.

Against Salisbury State of Maryland on Saturday, Oregon wing Rolin Lemmens said the team came out tight, allowing a Salisbury State three-point drop goal to start the game.

In using its speed, the Ducks unleashed 15 unanswered points

to end the first half at 15-3. "We had really nothing to lose," hooker Chris Lampe said.

Salisbury State, on the other hand, had everything to lose, including its composure. Lampe said the Salisbury State players started fighting among themselves as the Ducks pushed the score higher. By the end of the 28-8 spanking, all 23 Oregon players had received playing time.

This left the Ducks in an all-West Coast final with fourth-seeded UC San Diego, which had beaten second-seeded Central Connecticut State 28-3 to advance to the championship game. Lampe said the Ducks assumed UC San Diego would be "exceptionally good" considering the team hails from California, a hotbed for the best rugby in the

nation.

This proved true after the Ducks found themselves down 10-0 after the first half. UC San Diego matched the Ducks' speed — where the East Coast teams had faltered. However, the Ducks had come close to scoring twice, and still felt the game was in reach at halftime.

"We weren't going to lose because of a lack of effort," Lemmens said.

After both teams traded scores in the second half, San Diego made a final two-try surge late in the half to put the game out of reach, 29-5.

"We weren't disappointed because we knew we could have won," Clegg said. "By Sunday evening we were already talking about next year."

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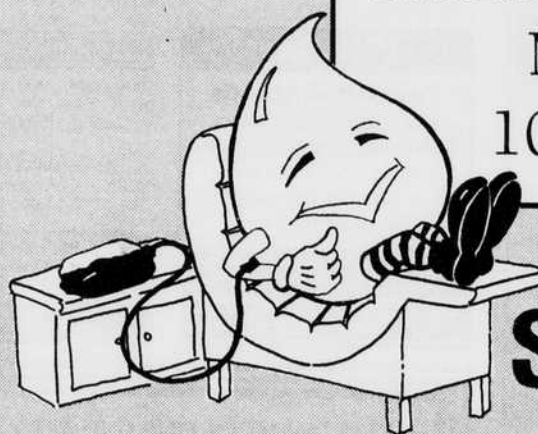
