

EMU: Elevator work stalled by grievances

means an extension in the EMU computer lab's hours is contingent on three things: the Constitution Court must make the election results official, the OUS must approve the fee increase, and the Computing Center's budget must be large enough to cover extra staffing.

If the Computing Center does not extend its hours, the ballot measure will be voided. But Unger is confident the computer lab's hours will change.

"I'm about as sure as a person possibly could be that we're going to be open 7 to 2 next year," he said.

In other EMU news, students voted overwhelmingly to pay for an elevator, which will make the EMU accessible to the disabled

— something that has not been possible since last spring.

Currently, the EMU is listed as ADA accessible, but with deficiencies, said EMU director Dusty Miller. The new elevator will allow access to the EMU Art Gallery, the Oregon Daily Emerald and the International Student Association.

The Constitution Court's decision to keep all elections results unofficial means the EMU cannot start work on the elevator until it is guaranteed the \$330,000 students approved for the \$550,000 project.

Guevara said she may file for an injunction that would allow the EMU to move forward in the process because no grievances were filed involving the elevator ballot measure.
