the Gulf War and is the commander of VFW Post No. 293, said she didn't think the controversy was warranted.

"It should in no way offend anyone who considers him- or

herself an American," she said. "It is not a symbol of the military. It is a symbol of the United States of America — not any particular administration, political party or any specific aspect of government.

The council will schedule a public forum in the coming weeks. If the council approves the flag, a design and permit process will be finalized and the flag will be erected by Veteran's Day.

Official to give speech on U.N./U.S. relations

Joe Byrns Sills, the director of the U.N. Information Centre in Washington, D.C., will give a keynote speech, "U.N./U.S. Relations: Where Do We Go From Here?" at 3 p.m. Friday in 100 Willamette.

Sills helped Kofi Annan finalize the recent peace agreement with Iraq. Prior to his current position, he was spokesman for Secretary-General Boutros-Ghali and for Secretary-General Javier Perez de Cuellar. The event is sponsored by the Model U.N. at the University.
