Oregon places fourth at nationals

Senior triathlete Matt Saraceno, leading the Oregon Club Sports triathlon team, captured the men's Collegiate National Championship title last Sunday at the Wildflower Triathlon in Lake San Antonio, Calif., beating a field of over 1,400 participants.

Placing all of Oregon's top three men's and women's triathletes in the top 20, the Ducks captured fourth place out of 33 college teams.

Team coordinator and triathlete Josiah Jones said Saraceno's victory was impressive but not a total surprise because of Saraceno's fifth-place finish at last season's championships.

Senior Tim Dodson and Jones, a junior, weren't far behind, placing 12th and 19th, respectively.

This is not to say that the women didn't hold their own. Junior Sarah Durney led the women in 12th place, while senior Penny Lidstone and junior Molly O'Connor both placed in the top 20.

Women's ultimate frisbee

Of the 10 West Coast teams vying for a spot at the national tournament in Minnesota, the Oregon Club Sports women's ultimate frisbee team expects to be one of the two that go. The second-seeded Ducks must finish first or second

and this weekend at the regional tournament in Santa Cruz, Calif., in order to move on.

Women's volleyball

After a poor showing in the Northwest Regional Tournament in Portland on Sunday, the Oregon Club Sports women's volleyball team ended its season in second place in Division A of the Columbia Empire Volleyball Association.

A shortage of players due to midterms, among other things, was the deciding factor in the

team's outing as the Ducks began play with only six players. Eventually, one more Oregon player showed up.

"Basically, we didn't do as well as we should've, especially after coming back from Texas where we did so well," middle blocker Holly Jarnagin said. "It was kind of a humbling experience."

The lack of players resulted in a lack of momentum as the team played sloppy in the beginning of each match but picked things up as the matches progressed.

"In pool play it would take the first game to wake us up," right hitter Donna Goode said. "In the second, we'd play a lot better, but we still couldn't quite pull it out."

Finding their niche late in pool play, the Ducks regrouped in playoff action, beating Bend in three games.

"When we finally got into bracket play, we were playing but we were really upset at how we did earlier," Goode said. "We knew that we could beat the team but we were playing with attitude—at least I was anyway, I can't really speak for anyone else."

After downing Bend, Oregon made it to the finals where it lost to the Kung-Pao Chicks.

"In the finals we figured that we should pull our heads out and actually play volleyball," Goode said. "It was too little too late I guess."
