

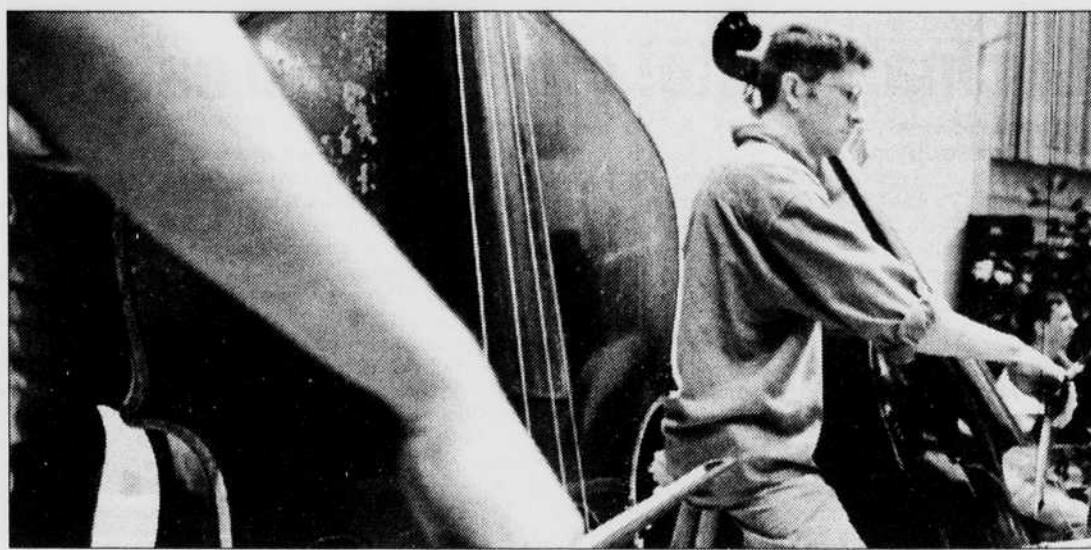

Symphony presents concerto winners

Winners of the music department's annual concerto competition will highlight the University Symphony's program in Bend on Friday and at the University's Beall Hall on Sunday afternoon.

Cellist Mary Walters and percussionist Tracy Freeze will perform works by Elgar and Rosauero, respectively, while the group will perform orchestral pieces by Strauss and Tchaikovsky.

"We're really taking a big step this quarter," symphony director Wayne Bennett said. "It's been a raising-the-bar time for the orchestra."

The orchestra and soloists will have their first chance to perform the repertoire at Mountain View High School in Bend. The group has performed in Florence each of the last two terms, and Bennett said the reasons for the excursions are

two-fold.

"The University can serve as a cultural outreach for communities in the state," he said. "As a state institution, we need to fulfill that role. Plus, it gives our students a chance to experience playing in an entirely different hall with different acoustics."

The program begins with Tchaikovsky's "Serenade for String Orchestra," with graduate student Eric Wenstrom conducting, followed by Richard Strauss' "Till Eulenspiegel's Merry Pranks."

Bennett said the Strauss is the story of a 14th-century prankster who was renowned for playing tricks and jokes on people at their expense.

Walters will kick off the second half of the program with her interpretation of the fourth movement of Elgar's "Concerto in E minor for Cello and Orchestra," a standard piece of symphonic repertoire, according to Bennett.

Ney Rosauero's "Concerto for Marimba and String Orchestra," a Latin-American piece featuring Freeze on marimba, will close the program.

"It's a marvelous piece," Bennett said. "The string orchestra is a strong rhythmic accompaniment for the marimba."

Bennett said the concert will be an opportunity for students to see the 'best of the best' in the music school, and a group that has improved greatly from years past due in part to a bright young string faculty.

"There's no way we could have attempted a program like this two or three years ago," he said.

The concert on Sunday begins at 2:30 p.m. at Beall Hall. Tickets are \$3 for students and seniors, and \$5 for general admission. They are available at the door.

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
