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tion," Baumgartner said. "We feel pretty confident, and we know what to expect the next two rounds — we need to go out and just play solid golf."

The top of both the team and individual standings played out predictably as the No. 1 team in the MasterCard Collegiate Golf Rankings, Arizona, and the No. 1 player in the country, Arizona State's Grace Park, stand atop their respective leaderboards.

The Wildcats' 290 gives them a three-stroke lead on Arizona State, which is ranked No. 2 in the country, and Tulsa. Park shot a five-under-par 68 for a two-stroke lead on Tulsa's Nina Laitinen. Arizona State's Kellee Booth, who is ranked No. 2 in the country, is in a four-way tie for third place, three strokes behind Park.

The No. 9 Ducks have three players tied for the team lead in 35th place individually. Paula Patterson, Karen Bristow and Pam Sowden all shot a two-over-par 75 at the 6,093-yard, par-73 Stanford Golf Club.

Kylie Wilson rounded out Oregon's top four scorers in the first

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Patterson, who is ranked No. 43 and was named a first team All-American last season, led the team to a sixth-place finish at the 1997 regional by tying for fifth place individually.

Patterson said she agrees with her coach's optimistic outlook heading into the final 36 holes of the tournament.

"I think that we did really well considering that it was the first day," Patterson said. "Today was basically just placement. [The second day] we usually characterize as moving day."

Oregon's 301 combined score ties them with Stanford, which is ranked No. 6 in the country and seeded third in the tournament. Texas and Southern California shot 297 totals to tie for fourth place. San Jose State and Oklahoma State share sixth place at 298, Brigham Young stands alone in eighth at 299, and Washington and Texas A&M both shot 300 to tie for ninth place.

After today's second round, the tournament concludes with Saturday's final round.



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
