Proposal would link senators, students

Senators would meet with students to listen to their complaints, concerns or suggestions

Student Senate outreach has often meant a grievance table in the EMU and office hours for senators.

Next year's Senate has a chance to improve that.

Sen. Selena Brewington has proposed a plan that would link students with senators, allowing the Senate to better anticipate problems and be more accessible.

Her proposal would also give the Senate more visibility and could attract more students to student government, Brewington said.

Senators would meet with a group of students and listen to any complaints, concerns, problems or suggestions they might have. Brewington foresees once-a-term meetings of about 180 students.

"It would be amazing for the Senate to do that kind of outreach," said Morgan Cowling, vice-president elect. "This just goes along with everything we're trying to do."

Next year's Senate will have to make the proposal a reality, and

Brewington said most of them "seem at least a little bit psyched up about it."

The Senate will likely work with other programs and departments to develop the process during the summer.

"We just want people to have a discussion," Brewington said. "It will give senators a better idea about what sorts of political things the Senate can do on campus."

That would extend the Senate's role in the ASUO. Senators are elected representatives of the students, but they usually react to grievances and questions brought to them instead of developing campaigns.

The "Town Hall Meetings" plan would allow senators to lobby other groups on behalf of students, adding the Senate's voice to complaints or concerns, Brewington said.

"At least we can get that voice heard," Brewington said. "As student representatives, that really is a role we should be playing."



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
