Men dropped in first round of Pac-10s

UC Santa Barbara did not allow the Oregon men's tennis team much time to enjoy its first-ever postseason appearance Friday.

The third-seeded Gauchos made short work of the sixth-seeded Ducks (11-13) by shutting them out 4-0 in a first-round NCAA Regional Championships dual match at UCLA.

It was the second time this season that UC Santa Barbara, which is ranked No. 22 in the Intercollegiate Tennis Associ-

ation Rankings, defeated Oregon.

Erwan Kergroach, ranked No. 52, lost in straight sets to the Gauchos' No. 55 Jong-Min Lee in No. 1 singles. Kergroach fell to 20-10 heading into the NCAA Individual Championships, which begin May 27.

In No. 2 singles, No. 68 Cory Guy of UC Santa Barbara defeated Guillermo Carter (14-16) in straight sets. The only other singles match completed was the Gauchos' Daniel Rheydt's straight-sets victory over Miguel Arriaga in No. 5 singles.

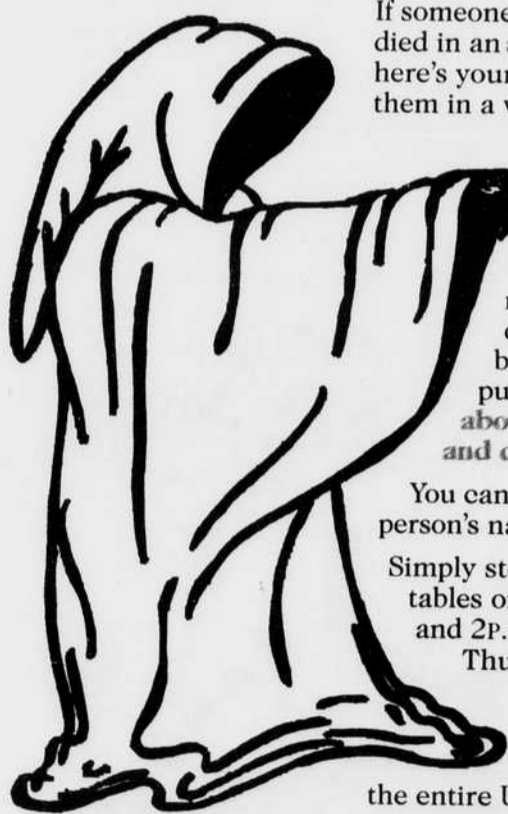
