

Law: Frichette to pursue real estate

devoted much of his energy to maintaining his buildings as well as a construction company that specializes in residential remodeling, which he co-owns with another graduate student.

"Steve is extraordinarily busy," said Jeff Sweet, a law student who manages one of Frichette's houses. "He has more on his table than anyone else I know."

For Frichette, who received his bachelor's degree in rhetoric from the University in 1988, building connections with the community was important while in school because he plans to get enough practice with small business law to eventually serve as a preventative consultant, he said.

"Small businesses need to know so much about law," he said, "but they often don't have the capital to pay for an attorney."

Juggling a family, a number of

demanding business endeavors and a full-time course load wasn't always easy, said Frichette, who has a 3-year-old son, Adam.

"It took a lot of effort and I'll probably be last in my class," Frichette said, laughing.

However, he thinks his professors probably liked seeing their students involved in extra-curricular activities, he said.

"They afforded me the opportunity to do what I had to do without giving out on their standards for me," he said.

Other students spent time interning or working at law firms, but because business law is not a major focus of the school, few students did the kind of "extra-curricular" work — owning and operating their own businesses — that Frichette was involved in.

Most law graduates will take the bar exam in July, but Frichette plans to hold off on taking it until

next February. He'd rather spend the next few months concentrating on his business and his family and putting a dent in the \$41,000 he now owes for his law education, he said.

Because Frichette is self-employed, his job does not depend on passing the bar. Studying law has already helped him immeasurably in his business ventures, he said. Leans and subcontractors for his construction company have become easier to deal with, he said.

Once he passes the bar, Frichette will also be able to represent smaller matters for his companies rather than hire out legal work.

With a law degree, Frichette will have familiarity with the skills needed to get involved with real estate or land transactions, Sweet said.

"[The degree] will allow him to do things on his own," he said.


