Items reported missing from Bean kitchen

A University Housing employee reported a burglary in the Bean kitchen after the Office of Public Safety notified the employee about a heat temperature alarm, which went off in the building Thursday, police said.

After the employee was notified of the alarm, he went to the kitchen and discovered many items missing, including food, storage and serving containers, as well as a door lock. The man also noticed that a door between the kitchen and the connecting Gano residence hall had not been secured.

The door lock to a beer and wine cooler was damaged but secure, police said.

No suspect information was available when the police report was written.

UO employee reports attempted burglary

An employee of the University Research Association reported an attempted burglary at her residence after she heard a large crashing sound coming from the rear of the house during early Monday morning, police said.

The woman said she heard the sound coming from the back door and immediately called the police. She told police she didn't see anyone leaving through the backyard but did not look to see either.

Nothing was taken from the house, and there was no evidence of forced entry. During a check of the area, officers found no suspects, fingerprints or footprints.

The case was suspended because of a lack of suspect information.

University student arrested for assault

A 32-year-old University student allegedly punched another student May 20 in the suspect's apartment, police said. The suspect claimed the man was trying to steal his girlfriend.

According to the victim and several witnesses, the victim, 28, was helping the woman move out of the apartment, which the suspect and the woman shared, when the suspect became angry and punched the man twice in the back of the head.

The suspect was arrested for assault and was lodged at the Lane County Adult Corrections Center.
