

Suspension: Rose one of Indiana's primary bench players

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check into the game.

"Jalen got a little excited and got down there too quick," Bird said today. "The only punch I saw was Harper hitting Reggie in the back, which I wouldn't even call a punch."

Miller, Jackson and Harper spoke to league security officials Tuesday as the NBA was conducting its investigation. The Pacers flew from Indianapolis to Chicago

after learning of the decision.

"I didn't feel like either Reggie Miller or Ron Harper deserved suspensions for what occurred, and the incident never really turned into an altercation," Walsh said. "Neither team wanted a fight. It was just the emotion of the game."

The absence of Rose will cost the Pacers one of their primary bench players. The small forward is averaging 8.0 points per game in the series and has been used to defend

Michael Jordan when both of them are in the game at the same time.

This series has been marked by almost constant complaining about the officiating.

After Game 2, the Pacers denounced Pippen's defensive tactics on point guard Mark Jackson. The officials gave less leeway to Pippen in Games 3 and 4, leading the Bulls to complain about a shifting standard.

Jackson and Jordan also com-

plained after Game 4 about a series of questionable calls made throughout the game — offensive fouls on Jordan and Dennis Rodman, a late three-pointer by Travis Best on which his foot appeared to be on the arc, and a non-call when Miller shoved Jordan out of the way to free himself for the winning shot.

Not everyone, however, has joined in the complaining.

"I've always said I'm trying to get away with as much as possible, so

you haven't heard me say anything about the officials," Miller said. "I'm going to stick with that."

Jackson kept up his complaints Tuesday after the Bulls practiced.

"It's almost impossible to play the game at this particular level if you can't be consistent on the calls," he said. "What's the norm? I don't want the norm is. It's day to day."

Bird said he expects the remarks of Jackson and Jordan to have an effect Wednesday night.

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
