Local Athletes of Note

Lance Deal: Lives in Eugene ... competing in men's hammer throw ... three-time Olympian (1988, '92, '96) ... holds American record at 270-9 ... gold at 1995 Pan-American Games ... silver at 1996 Olympics ... ranked No. 1 six times in United States

Dan O'Brien: Born in Portland ... attended high school in Klamath Falls, Ore. ... competing in men's 110 meters hurdles ... one-time Olympian (1996) ... holds world record in decathlon ... three-time world champion in decathlon ... gold at 1996 Olympics

Shannon Lemora: Former Oregon star ... competing in men's mile ... personal record is 3:57.47 for mile ... second in Pac-10 in 800 in 1992 ... fifth on all-time Ducks' list for 800 meters with 1:47.75 in 1991

Scott McGee: Former Oregon star ... competing in men's hammer throw ... former NCAA champion for Ducks ... second on all-time Ducks' list for hammer throw with 225-10 in 1991 ... fifth in 1997 U.S. championships ... personal record is 243-11

Karl Keska: Former Oregon star ... competing in men's 5,000 meters ... twice won Pac-10 ... two-time Pac-10 champion in 1,000 meters

Steve Dering: Lives in Eugene ... competing in men's hammer throw ... two-time All-American at Syracuse ... seventh in 1997 U.S. championships ... ranked in top-10 nationally six times

Piotr Bucłarski: Attends Oregon ... third on all-time Ducks' list for pole vault with 18-2 1/2 ... one-time All-American ... automatic qualifier for 1998 NCAA Championships
