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## Charity: Ride benefits the disabled

severely handicapped. The name originally stood for Play Units for the Severely Handicapped because the organization built play structures. Then it changed to People Understanding the Severely Handicapped, but it now stands alone as an encompassing name.

The organization expects to raise \$300,000 this year, a far cry from the \$1,200 raised by the original "Journey of Hope" 10 years ago when Bruce Rogers rode from Florence to Virginia.

"What he has started is hard to even put into words," first-time team member George Kostin said. Almost 400 cyclists have participated in the "Journey of Hope" over the past 10 years. Kostin said he expects this to be "the summer of a lifetime, plain and simple."

Basile, the California State-Chico chapter founder, said there is more to this trip than just pumping pedals.

"Not only is it a service project, but you get to know who you are," he said. "It makes you feel like you're alive. It gives you a purpose for being here."

Along the trip, the team will frequently stop to present Kids on the Block, a puppet show about disabled people. And Saturday, the team volunteered at the Special Olympics at Hayward Field.

"To see the dreams and the thought that all these people have is just incredible," said Kostin, an alumni of the Pi Kappa Phi fraternity at Stockton State University in New Jersey.

"People with a disability are not stupid," added Basile. "Just be-

cause they look not normal, so to speak, does not mean they do not have the comprehension you and I do.

"People do not need to be afraid of disabled people."

Oregon's chapter, the newest fraternity on campus, raised about \$3,000 for PUSH America this year, tripling the national requirement.

"It's really nice to see that Pi Kappa Phi is doing something different in the greek system," chapter member Justice Rhodes said.

On Aug. 13, the team will roll into Richmond, Va., and meet up with two other teams that started in San Francisco. In the final two days, about 125 bikers will ride from Richmond to Washington, D.C., to culminate this summer's journey and a decade's work.

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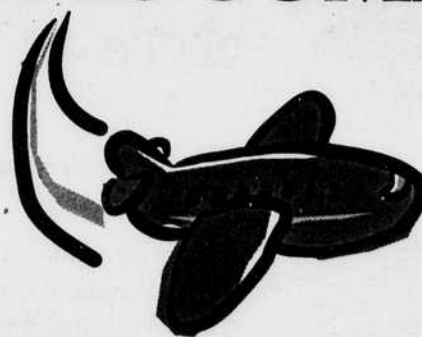
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
