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200 meters."

For Davis, not winning the title was disappointing more than just for personal reasons.

"I wanted to give coach [Dellinger] a championship in his last season," he said. "That's what I'd been thinking about all season but it didn't work out. I gave it a shot."

The steeplechase was won by Arkansas' Matt Kerr in a time of 8:36.95.

The meet concluded Saturday,

with triple jumper Gregg Bleakney the only Duck in action. The senior from Bainbridge Island, Wash., went into the competition ranked fifth but finished just 14th after failing to make the finals.

"I'm pretty disappointed," he said. "It just didn't go my way."

Bleakney scratched on his first

attempt then had two jumps of about 51 feet, finishing with a best of 51 feet, 1 inch.

"My first jump was a really good jump, maybe my best jump all year," Bleakney said, "but I scratched, which was probably the worst thing I could have done. I didn't want to scratch my first jump because you only get three to make the finals, so that only gave me two more jumps. I had to switch my whole game plan, which I wasn't ready for."

With a jump of 55-8 1/4, Arkansas' Robert Howard won the event for the second straight year.

Bleakney finished his Oregon career third on the school's all-time list with his season best of 53-9 3/4, although a better mark at the USA Championships in New Orleans later this month would still count toward the Oregon record, which is 53-11 1/4.
