the summer to their advantage to complete the renovation so the new facilities may be enjoyed by both faculty and students as early as time and construction allows.

Henry is also behind the construction of the Onyx Bridge area. The science library, located under the plaza, has been having a problem with leakage. Tearing up the entire plaza will allow for new waterproofing. In the process, wheelchair access ramps and a few covered bike racks will be added.

The area will remain under construction for about another month. Henry said he wants to try to eliminate the loud noise as early as next week to avoid disturbing summer school classes and early summer functions. In mid-September, the bike path

will reopen with minor details to be completed.

Also finishing early should be the renovation of the EMU. Project manager and EMU director Dusty Miller said the project should be done by August 1, with one exception. Sbarro, one of the original eleven restaurants, pulled out of its contract, and the EMU is seeking a new Italian pasta luncheonette to fill the space.

Students and faculty should

enjoy the fact that there will be no more construction, block-offs and inconvenience around the EMU area, Miller said. The campus community should enjoy the newer area and surroundings as well as the numerous and different choices the EMU will offer, he said.

A second EMU renovation is also projected to be finished by August 1. The ASUO Multicultural Center will be expanding into the old Footnotes office to accommodate the Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender Alliance. The office also will receive a ramp for wheelchair access. In addition, the surrounding areas will receive new doors and fire sprinklers.

Both projects should be completed earlier or on the projected date of August 3, Miller said.
