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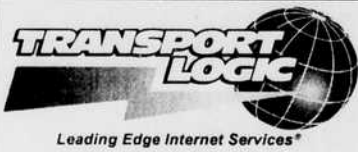

Activist to speak on human rights

East Timorese human rights activist Fernando da Arujo will speak about human rights issues in Indonesia Saturday at 7 p.m. in the EMU Fir Room.

"Injustices in Indonesia: A Personal Story and Resolutions for a New Era" will focus on people's personal experiences and what is now happening in Indonesia concerning human rights since the fall of the Suharto regime.

Arujo is a former political prisoner in Indonesia, recipient of the 1992 Reebok Human Rights Award and founder of Renetil, an underground organization of Timorese students studying in Indonesia.

This event is sponsored by the Student Peace Coalition, the Survival Center, Center for Asian and Pacific Studies and East Timor Action Network.

Three-day conference to combat hate crimes

The Northwest Coalition Against Malicious Harassment's 12th annual conference will begin Friday at Lane Community College.

The conference costs \$30 for students, but arrangements can be made for those who cannot afford it, said NWC office coordinator Robin Wantch. Community members can register for \$80, which includes meals.

The theme of this year's three-day conference is "A Vision of Freedom: Organizing for Justice in the Northwest." The conference focuses on "combating hate crimes and organized bigotry," according to NWC.

Keynote speakers include: Dolores Huerta, secretary and treasurer of the United Farmworkers of America; Myrlie Evers-Williams, civil rights activist and former board chair of the NAACP;

and Dr. Lance Hill, director of the Southern Institute for Research and Education.

NWC represents the region that includes Colorado, Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington and Wyoming.
