Calobo to frolic at WOW Hall tonight

The performance will celebrate the band's latest release, 'Live at the Crystal Ballroom'

Portland über-band Calobo will perform tonight at the WOW Hall to celebrate the release of its fifth album, "Live at the Crystal Ballroom."

The folk-rock septet recorded the 11-track album in late May during two nights at P-Town's Crystal Ballroom.

Capturing the electricity of a live show was a challenge for the band's lead male vocalist and co-founder David Andrews.

"It used to be where you could not put on a Calobo record and feel like you're at a live show," he said. "But I think finally, this record itself has just captured a show."

Andrews championed the band's latest release as one of its best because it captures the electricity of a

live show coupled with what he called "a current movement of [Calobo's] music and energy."

He noted that the current movement of the band heard on "Live at the Crystal Ballroom" combines the band's musical backgrounds that include reggae, jazz, bluegrass, opera, classical piano and country.

But Andrews said he prefers to dub the melting pot of musical direction as "acoustic groove soup."

Included in the 11 songs on the new release are five previously unreleased tracks as well as tunes from Calobo's first four albums.

"Live at the Crystal Ballroom" starts to spin with the Andrews-written opening track "Seasons of Love." This tune combines some superb acoustic guitar playing with vocal folk from Andrews and Michele Van Kleef.

Other highlights on the album include songs "Funkytown" and "Old Nisqually." Both tracks include the mandolin might of Caleb Klauder with some serious piano power from Jenny Conlee.

Andrews said he likens the feel of "Crystal Ballroom" to Calobo's 1992 release "Running in the River," which he said was the band's best-selling record.

He said he feels "Running in the River" was so popular because it was originally not made to sell to the public.

"It's got so much energy on it," he said. "We recorded for two days — 14 hours a day. We also did not intend to sell it — we made it for us."

But Andrews said "Live at the Crystal Ballroom" was made for the fans who wanted another album with first cuts.

Tickets for tonight's performance are \$8 in advance and \$9 at the door. Doors swing open at 9 p.m., and the show starts at 9:30.

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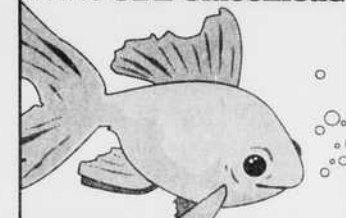
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
