"It was just kind of a dream," Latimer says of his final season. "As I was going on, the confidence kept building, and pretty soon it just felt like I could do anything. It was three months later and I was like, man, I rushed for 3,000 yards.

In fact, his yardage total was 10th-best all-time for high school running backs nationally. Although he was eventually named an all-American by BlueChip Illustrated after his senior season, Latimer was feeling the pressure of being a star before, during and after his attempts to break the

Latimer began to feel the heat initially when people began questioning the credibility of his record during the season. Air Academy had an infamous rushing attack, and Latimer was a member of three consecutive squads that ran for at least 3,000 yards.

"A lot of people thought I was just getting a lot of carries, but my sophomore year we rushed for 3,000 yards as a team; it was just spread between three other tailbacks," Latimer says. "Then my junior year, I had about 1,500 yards and our other tailback had about 1,600 yards. We had always been rushing for 3,000 yards as a team, it just so happened that I was the only back that year.'

And what a year it was, as Latimer twice ran for six touchdowns and piled up at least 300 yards in a game six times. But as the year progressed, the intensity of approaching a state record began to take its toll, and Latimer entered the last game of the season just three yards short of the magical 3,000.

"I didn't break the record until the fourth quarter, and I had 30something carries," Latimer says. "I just remember, probably about the fourth quarter sometime. I knew I hadn't broken it yet but I didn't know how many yards I had. I was on the sidelines frustrated, with tears in my eyes, and was like, man, I'm never going to do this.

process earned himself a scholarship to Oregon. With the Ducks facing the graduation of Dino Philyaw in 1995 and the poten-tial loss of Ricky Whittle to the NFL the following season, Duck fans were more than happy to see a 3,000-yard rusher amongst the redshirts.
