



# **Ducks and Beavers may not be so civil**

Throw aside the records from this season and those past. Forget about statistical analysis or numeric comparisons. Consider matchup problems, but know it will be more a question of desire.

It's Civil War time.

The No. 15 Oregon Ducks (8-2 overall, 5-2

Pacific-10 Conference) take the field Saturday at 3:30 at Corvallis' Parker Stadium to face their instate-rivals, the Oregon State Beavers (4-6, 1-6).

"The Civil War speaks for itself," Oregon linebacker Dietrich Moore

said. "It's going to be an all-out battle. They're going to play us probably tougher than they play anybody this year, and we're going to try and go in and do the same.'

Oregon comes into the game riding a twogame winning streak with wins over Washington and Arizona State at home. The Beavers, on the other hand, took last week off after losing four straight conference games to Arizona, Washington, California

## regon State seeks first five-win season since '71

The Beavers have not beaten Oregon since 1993, but that could change this weekend

Oregon State is basically nine points away from a 4-3 record in the Pacific-10 Conference this season.

But almost doesn't count in football.

It's been a season of oh-so-close losses for the Beavers, who have a chance to win their fifth game in a season for the first time since 1971. A victory this weekend would also mean two conference wins for Oregon State, which has not done that since 1993, when it beat Arizona State, then beat Oregon at Autzen Stadium in the final game of the sea-

Oregon State (4-6 overall, 1-6 Pac-10) has posted some impressive numbers this season, but it has lost its last three games by a er in Oregon State history to rush for 1,000 total of nine points. The Beavers almost single handedly ruined No. 2 UCLA's undefeated record when they tied the game at 34 with just 31 seconds remaining two weeks ago.

The Beavers couldn't hold on, however, falling prey to Cade McNown and his

late-game heroics. At the helm of the Beaver offense are redshirt freshman quarterback Jonathan Smith and

tailback Ken Simonton, who have compiled some pretty impressive numbers of their own.

The Beavers had 582 yards of total offense against Washington and 491 yards against the Bruins. Simonton needs just 129 yards against the Ducks to become the fourth playyards in a season.

"[Simonton] is a darter and a dasher," Oreon head coach Mike Bellotti said. "H very big, he sort of hides behind the lineman, then all of a sudden he's hitting the hole full speed and you don't know where he is.

They do a great job with him on screens and he's a very deceptive runner. He runs with great power because he runs with great speed and momentum."

For Oregon, stopping the run has always been a concern. But last week the Ducks held Arizona State to 117 yards rushing after the Sun Devils rushed for more than 400 yards against Oregon last season.
