

Workshop will offer job search advice

The event, sponsored by the Career Center, will bring together students and recruiters tonight

Brian Jenarro, a member of the Delta Sigma Phi fraternity, felt it might be helpful to hold a small workshop to help his fraternity brothers get ready for the Jan. 27-28 "Career and Internship Fair." So many people responded that it expanded to include the whole greek system and then expanded again into a full-fledged Career Center event.

Tonight's "Career Fair Employers Night" is an event designed to help students prepare for everything from resumes to knowing what to ask employers at interviews. It will feature a panel of six recruiters from area businesses. The event is being held in the EMU Fir room from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m.

"We did this to educate students and help them understand what we need to do to prepare ourselves to get a job in the real world," Jenarro said. "When I looked into it a little bit, I couldn't believe that something like this didn't already exist."

The main speaker will be April Razez, a recruiter for Enterprise Rent-A-Car. She will give insights into how to approach recruiters at the Career Fair and how to present yourself. She will also give tips on what recruiters look for in a job candidate.

Other presenters include Colin

Slade, Vice-President and Corporate Controller at Tektronix; Tom Dutoit, from State Farm Insurance; Sue Ray, from Target Stores; Joice Ziemlok, from Lane County Transit and Jennifer Paaue-Risse, from Cintas Corporation.

"We didn't want to shut any people out of the event; so we only invited presenters who were looking from the general business perspective," Jenarro said. "Students will be able to get a good idea of what to expect because these are things that are pretty universal for all industries."

Virginia Garrison, event planner for the Career Center, stresses the importance of preparation for people seeking a job.

"People looking for a job this summer, especially those graduating in June, have to start now," Garrison said. "It's only five months away. Recruiters are looking now."

"The employers night will definitely be an advantage for those people who are aggressively seeking a job at the Career Fair."

Tonight's event is sponsored by the Career Center, Delta Sigma Phi Fraternity and Chi Omega sorority. Admission is free and refreshments and snacks will be provided.

Jenarro hopes that this idea will catch on. The Career Center is already planning for a similar event next year.

"Next year looks like it will be pretty good," Jenarro said. "We already have IBM and Anderson Consulting interested. This is the type of thing that businesses want to participate in."
