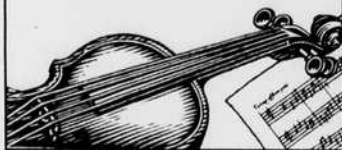


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FIGHTING POLLUTION

Campaign promotes pollution education

Members of the Committee to Re-establish OSPIRG promoted their new campaign to educate people about the poor condition of Oregon's waterways in the EMU Amphitheater Tuesday.

"People know that the Willamette is grossly polluted," said committee member Court-

ney Hights. "We wanted them to know the extent of it."

Group members offered students the opportunity to send a postcard to Gov. John Kitzhaber asking him to take greater action against the use of pesticides around waterways.

"We have received 300 postcards so far," said member Melissa Unger. "We've had a wonderful response."

The group also will hold an informational meeting tonight at 5:30 p.m. in the EMU Fir Room to further outline its goals.

State Rep. Floyd Prozanski and Lane County Commissioner Peter Sorenson will be the speakers.

Although OSPIRG would like the opportunity to be reinstated on campus, its main goal is to get people involved in its activities, said member Erica Boberg.

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
