

Student pleads not guilty to charges

The former EMU employee entered the plea to three charges of public indecency

University student Jeremy Price Bucy pleaded not guilty to three counts of public indecency at his arraignment Wednesday.

Bucy, 23, was arrested on Nov. 3 by Eugene police in connection with several campus incidents over the past two years involving men masturbating in the Knight Library and the EMU. He was working in the EMU when he was arrested.

In his Lane County Circuit Court appearance, Bucy requested a court-appointed attorney for his March 3 trial.

Public indecency is a Class A misdemeanor that is punishable by a maximum of one year in jail, a \$5,000 fine or both. Bucy has no prior criminal record.

Police arrested Bucy after they matched his DNA with a semen sample taken at the scene of a crime, according to a police report.

Police confronted Bucy on Aug. 31, and he agreed to submit a DNA test.

A police report said the results concluded there is less than a one in 10 billion chance the semen sample from the scene of the crime came from anyone other than Bucy.

Bucy was fired from his job in the EMU's Greatful Bread bakery the day of his arrest. He is not in jail and is enrolled in classes at the University.

The University Office of Public Safety has information on Bucy's case posted on its Web site at safetyweb.uoregon.edu.

Eugene police Sgt. Rick Gilliam is asking that any women who believe they were victimized and haven't reported it to contact him at 346-2904.

Bucy spoke with the Emerald for a December story in which he was not named.

"I'm dealing with this on many levels," he said in December. "I want to talk to people about the whole thing, but I have to be careful because of the nature of the case."
