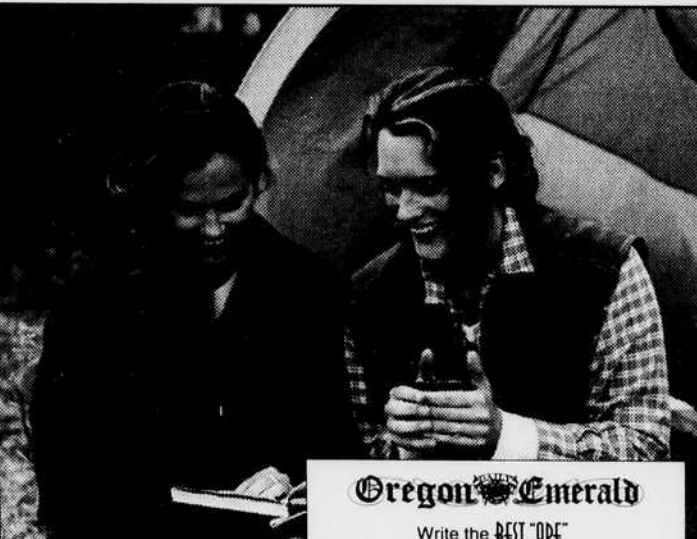

"For students looking for jobs, interviewing skills are as important as study skills," she said. "The best thing to bring is an air of confidence, but we also recommend four or five copies of your resume and a notebook to take down names. It's good to keep in contact with the people you've met at the fair."

The Career Center, in response to student concern, is also making an effort to open future fairs to a greater diversity of applicants.

"By November's fair there will be a wider range of opportunities for people looking into more specific types of careers," Garrison said.

looked like it had been altered."

The item just appeared in the facility, and it didn't seem to be placed there maliciously, Hicks said.

He said OPS has no leads as far as a suspect and will not pursue the matter much further.

"I doubt if we'll pursue it too far," Hicks said. "It is possible

that when someone reads the report, they will come in and apologize."

Hicks said he does not believe this scare was related in any way to the scare at Johnson Hall almost two months ago.

"We average about two a year," Hicks said. "But for the last couple of years it has been less than that."

When bomb scares do happen, they usually come in groups, he said. Even if they're not necessarily related, that's just how it happens.
