"Kenny is banged up physically and emotionally," Kearney said. "We want to get his wheels back under him between our home and tournament schedule. We definitely want him back for Arizona State, and I'd say the chances of that are 100 percent by then."

Oregon's 24-17 loss could have been a 24-23 loss if Cox had wrestled and won by decision; a pin would have given the Ducks a victory. If the Ducks had Cox in the lineup and a wrestler at 133, a win for Oregon would have been very probable.

Cox is currently practicing

with the team. If he does not wrestle this weekend, Kearney said the team has nobody to fill in at his weight class.

New Additions

The Ducks are looking into recruiting a wrestler to fill the empty spot at 133 pounds. Kearney did not specify the name or class of any of these students, but said they had wrestled in high school and at the state level.

"We don't know if they can get eligible or in shape to contribute fast enough," Kearney said. "But if they clear NCAA rules and continue academic progress, they could compete this year."

Kearney said he is waiting to hear from the Pacific-10 Conference office about technicalities of the recruitment. Oregon should know more about the possibility of new wrestlers by the middle of next week.

Over the Top

With Chael Sonnen (197); Doug Lee (184); Daryl Christian (157); and Sean Morgan (165) having strong seasons, the Ducks are in a position to do something they have never done before — finish with four wrestlers earning All-American honors.

And no Oregon team has ever placed better than 11th at the NCAA Tournament.

Oregon ice hockey races for nationals

Oregon Club ice hockey will try to remain in the race for a national bid when it plays host to Western Washington this weekend at 7 p.m. Friday and 8:40 p.m. Saturday at the Lane County Ice Arena.

The Ducks (14-4-1) are currently fifth regionally, and only the top four are chosen for nationals,

making this weekend crucial. The Ducks have already dismantled Western Washington in Bellingham, Wash., and hope to add to their four-game winning streak with a sweep.

Oregon eyes will be on the Stanford-UCLA contest this weekend. With a split this weekend and a sweep of California next weekend, Stanford could bump Oregon from Pacific-8 Tournament considerations.

Their last home games will give the Ducks an opportunity for perfection.

"We would like to end the season a perfect 11-0 in the Northwest," said forward Tyler Shaffar.

While injuries will not be a factor against Western Washington, it is still unclear if team captain Ari Friedman will return from his four-game suspension for a fighting incident against UCLA.

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
