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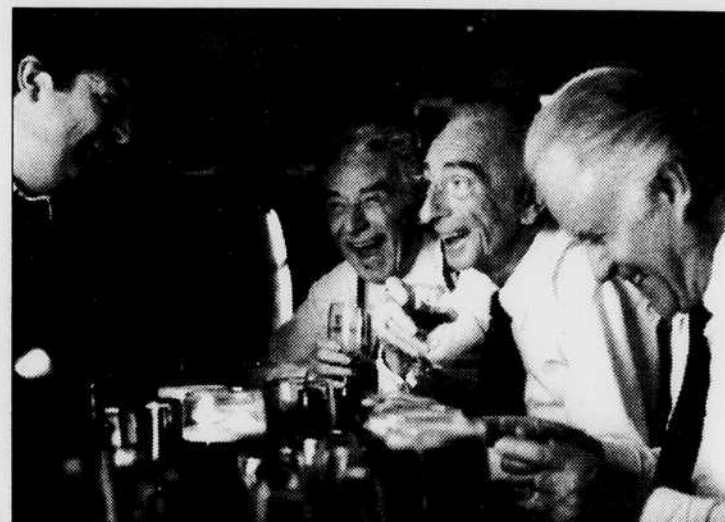
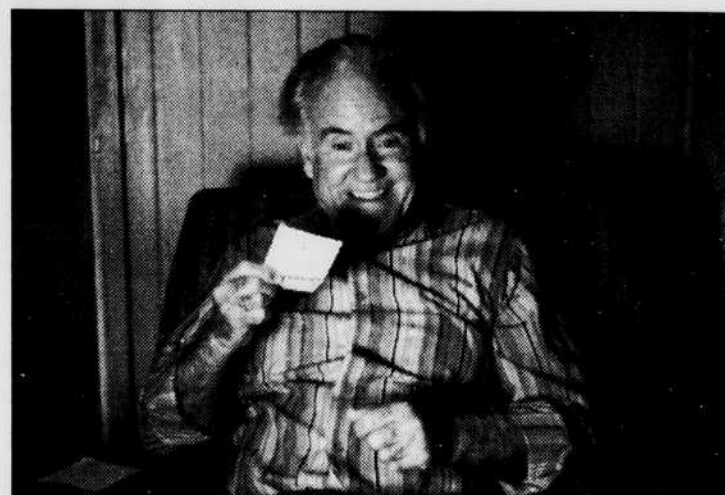
your chance to see something without a reconstituted plot spewed out by profit-minded Hollywood producers.

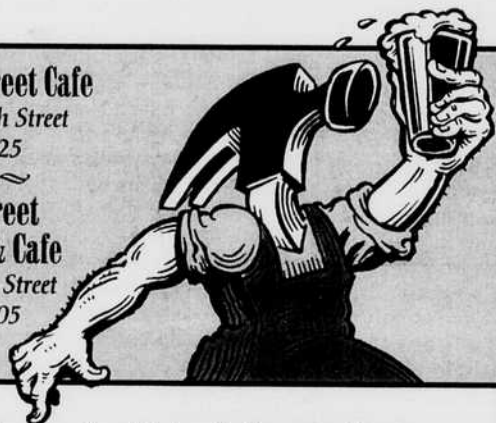
