er with previous bands. Also, four of the five members attended the University in the late 1980s.

Ferguson explained that much of Kerosene Dream's early material sprung from songs written by him and Coey in previous bands.

"We both were writing a lot of songs, [and we decided] to go for another group," he said.

On their latest album, released in 1998, the band explores a poppy, western sound. Present are elements of classic rock gleaned from influences such as Neil Young, Tom Petty and John Hiatt. Also, the band takes cues from experimental music.

"I think we have a lot of The Band [who played with Bob Dylan] in us," Ferguson said. "We're not a big jam band, but we do have some instrumental and experimental stuff."

Currently, however, the band is writing new material that tends to stray from what Ferguson described as a "dusty," country-like feel. They are instead focusing on straight-ahead rock, he added.

The members of Kerosene Dream hope to begin recording a third album by March of this year, with plans to release it sometime this summer.

"We keep going in to do new albums to keep ourselves on top of our craft," Ferguson said.
