Oregon now stands alone in first place in the Pac-10 with a 14-2 record, and UCLA is a game behind the Ducks, at 13-3. It's a disgrace that the Ducks are not ranked higher than the Bruins in both polls — they've defeated the teams that beat UCLA, and they beat the Bruins by 27 points.

The Ducks post a 23-4 overall record compared to the Bruins' 22-7. Even though UCLA had a tougher preseason schedule, the Bruins managed just one win over a ranked opponent, North Carolina.
