Although the Ducks as a team struggled through most of the year, the individuals, for the most part, did not. Kearney said 149-pound Mark Castle, 141-

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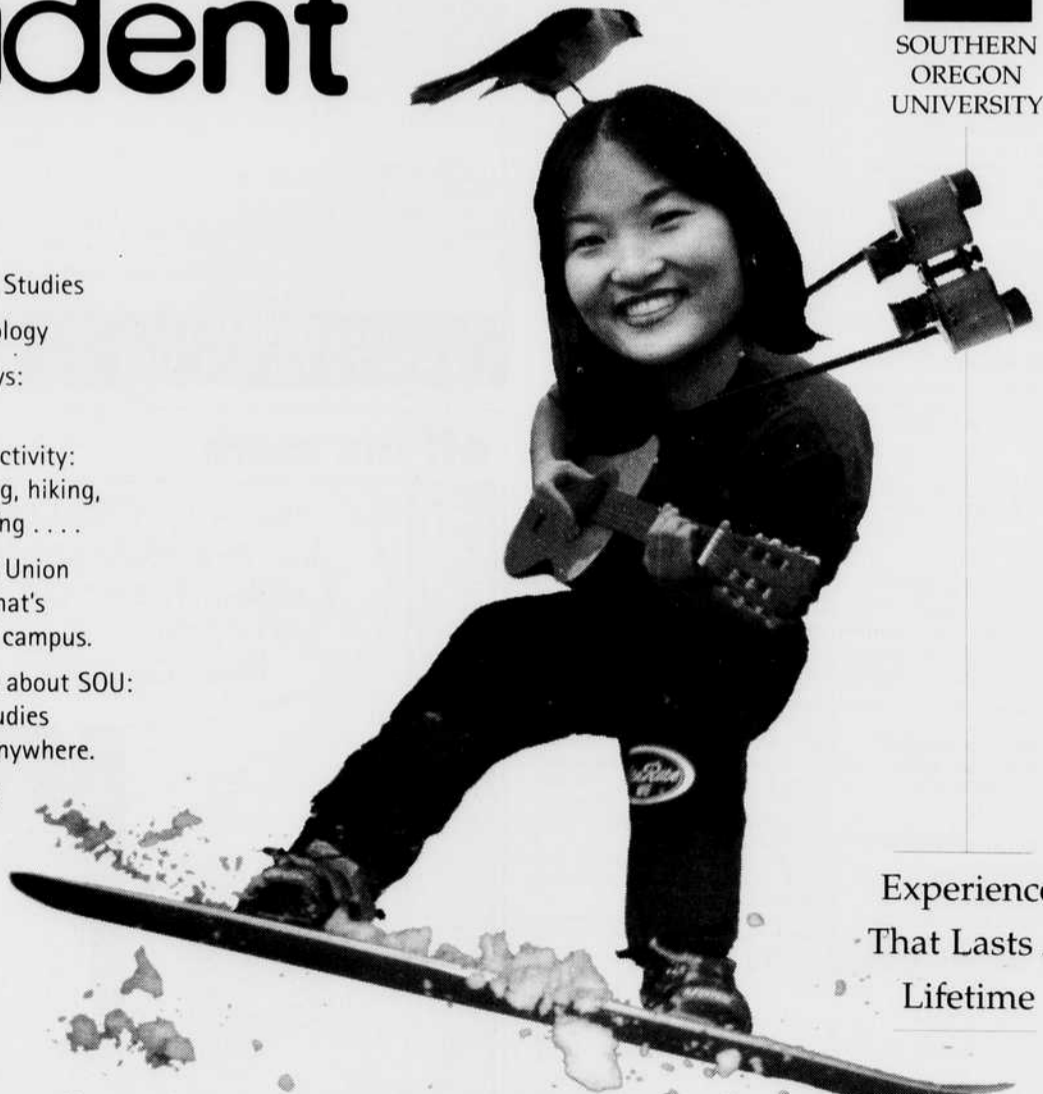
