- More events on campus — lectures, concerts, and productions

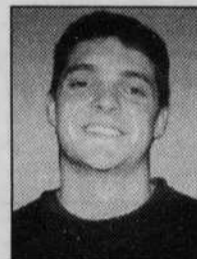
- Betterment of Campus lighting and increased campus safety

Log in and choose ASUO Elections link from menu.

Vote!

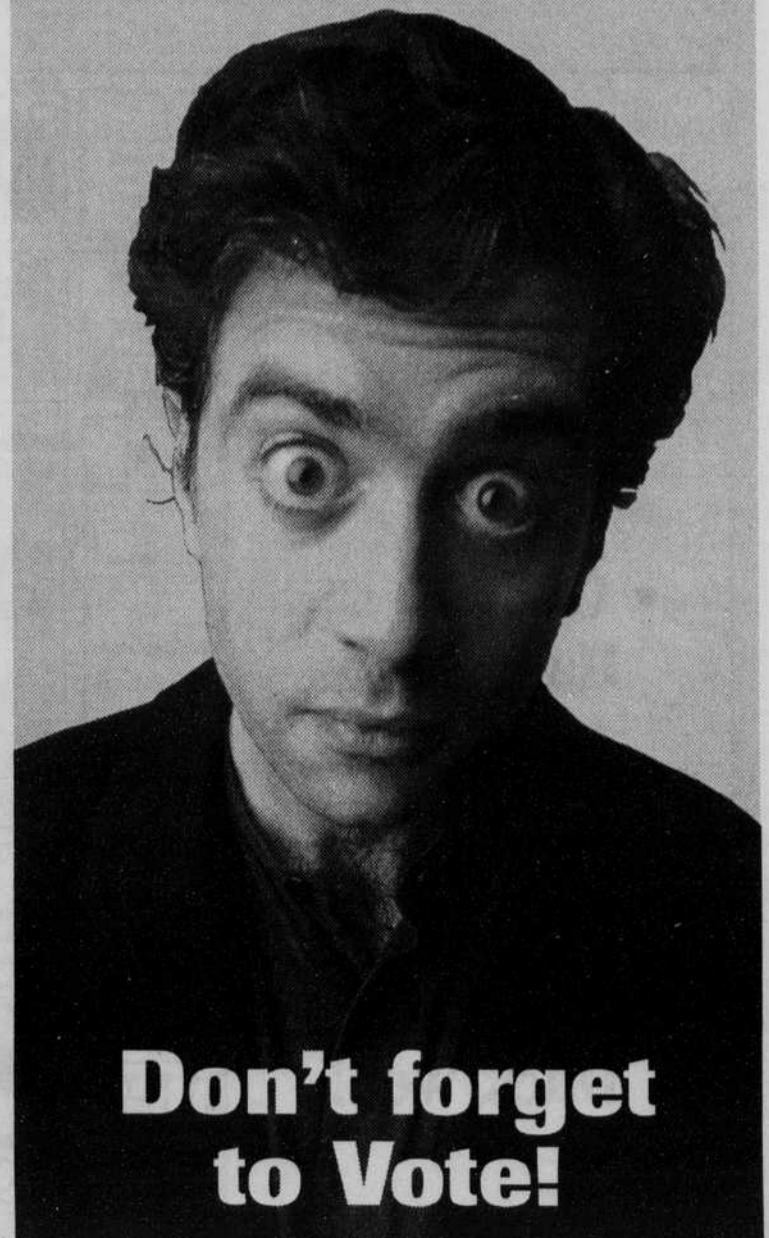
- Choose your candidates from the list provided and click on the box on the right side of their name to cast your vote.
- If you are writing in a person for a position, type their name in the write-in box and click the corresponding box at the right of the screen. If you do not click the box, the computer will not register the write-in.

Step 4

You must click the "Cast Vote" button at the end of the screen to have your votes count. If you do not push this button your votes will not be counted. It is very important that you cast your vote.
