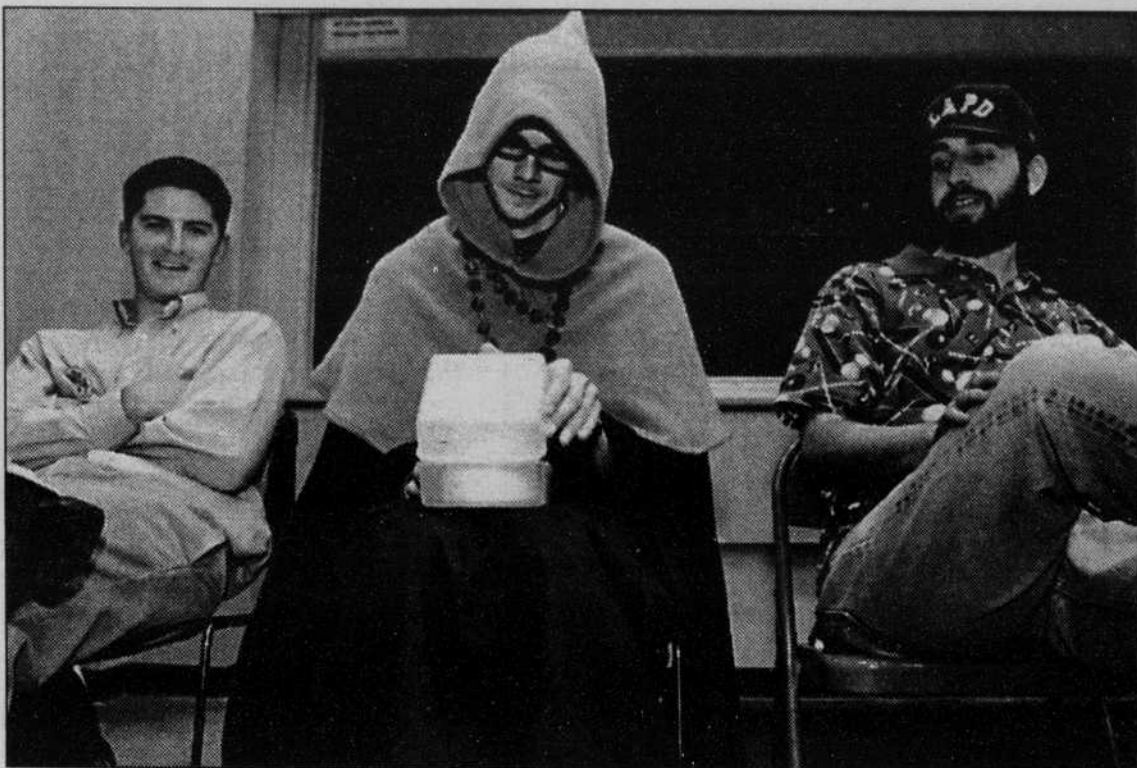

answered questions on a variety of topics, were asked to state the single issue they felt was of paramount importance.

Nick Bostic felt e-mail was the most pressing issue facing the University. Bostic is a freshman and wants to make sure that students still receive e-mail through their University account after they graduate.

"I know lots of grads who would contribute to the University what they would be giving to AOL if they still had their e-mail," he said.

For Wylie Chen, ASUO accountability through the restructuring of the ASUO executive is the most important issue.

"The problem in itself is that students don't know or care what the ASUO is," Chen said. "The main issue is letting students know what programs and services we have to offer."

Tamir Kriegel said he felt the ASUO has no purpose, and plans to retire as soon as he is elected. He said he believed that the ASUO had no effect on any student programs.

"There is no point in student government," he said. "Hopefully

everything will crumble and fall on itself."

Brett Bettin looked to a higher power in response to all questions posed and only gave his answer after consulting with his running mate, God.

"God doesn't want to talk to you right now," Bettin responded. "I have faith that God knows what he's doing." Bettin said he would put the campus in God's hands if elected.

For Dan Reid, access to education is at the top of the agenda.

"Access to higher education is probably the biggest issue facing campus right now," Reid said.
