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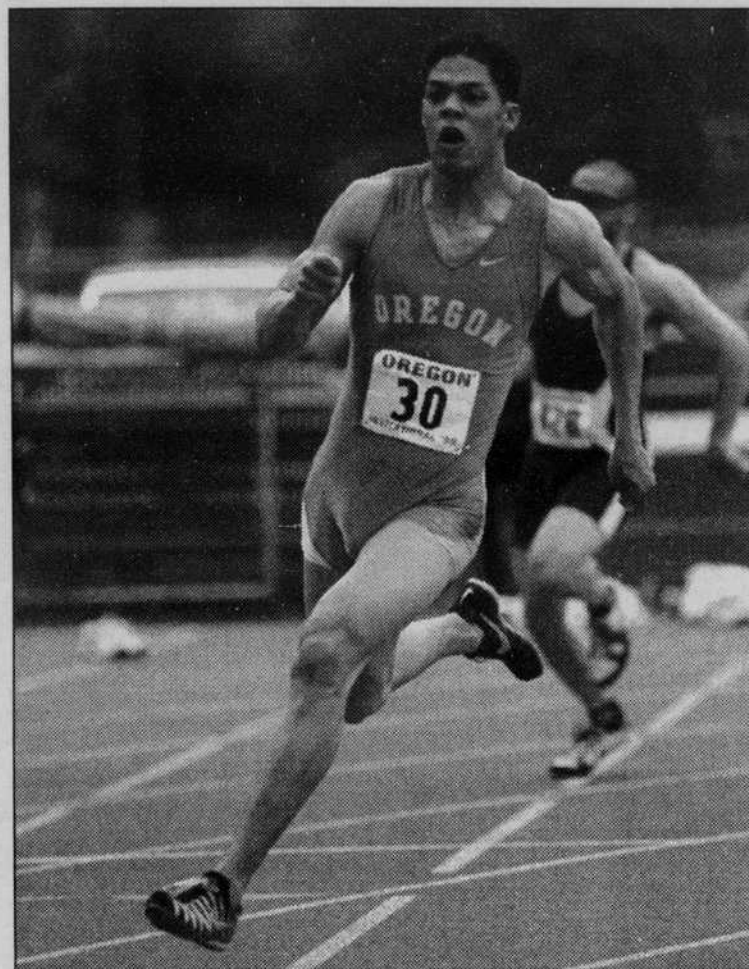
the conference leaders in every offensive category but triples, in which they're tied for fourth. And recently Oregon's pitching has come along.
