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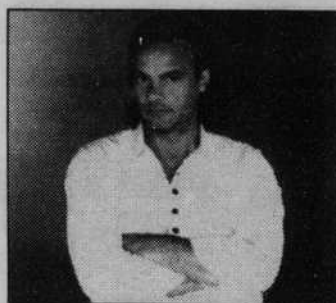

He's played with Robert Cray, Muddy Waters, Bobby "Blue" Bland and Bonnie Raitt, just to name a smattering of greats. Salgado is currently on tour to promote his newest compact disc, "Wiggle Outta This."

hind his Blues Brothers character, Jake. The inspiration apparently came in 1979 while Belushi was in Eugene filming "Animal House."

Sunday night's main-stage entertainment begins with Charlie Brown, juggler extraordinaire. Following his act, local band Valley Boys crank it up. The Boys have been together for 15 years and perform mostly covers, ranging from 1950s- and '60s-style tunes to current country selections. They've been called a "bop-till-you-drop" dance band by at least one reviewer.
