dents encounter people who expect them to know and understand American culture just because they speak the same language.

The ISA, entirely run by students, plays an important role in making international students comfortable. It has provided needed support for both Widjojo and Haya Matsumoto, the program's co-director. The association is a student umbrella for other international student groups that provides support, creates programs, works with the Office of International Education and Exchange and assists with gaining familiarity of campus and American culture while promoting international diversity on campus.

For Widjojo, "it's a home away from home."

The fifth-year architecture major said she hadn't lived away from her parents for more than three months before coming here four years ago. She was lured by the University's reputation and the fact that her brother attends Oregon State, but she has stayed in large part because of the network of friends she has found in the ISA.
