only heightens a viewer's fear.

These two aren't even interested in getting inside the watchers' heads and pulling the old "gotcha" tricks, prevalent in any "Friday the 13th" or "Halloween" offering. Instead, they force us to get inside our own heads to revisit the nooks and crannies where our real bogeymen live, the ones that go creak in the night.

From the opening credits, which are a brief explanation of what you're about to witness, "The Blair Witch Project" has you trapped. As the film unreels, we see the three students — Heather Donahue, Joshua Leonard and Michael Williams — readying themselves for a trip to a small Maryland town, Burkittsville, and what they hope is a rip-roarin' class project.

The trio for the most part scoffs at the Blair Witch legend, until they meet Mary Brown, Burkittsville's resident loony but expert on local lore. As the story goes, children have been kidnapped and never seen again.

Still more hyped than freaked, the filmmakers head off toward a remote site in the Black Hills with cameras and camping gear in tow. Once out among the trees, strange occurrences and even stranger nocturnal noises begin to disturb their collective psyche.

The question "What if the tale of Blair Witch is true?" begins to gnaw at them. They become lost, and lack of food and a map begins to wear on them. And those noises at night just keep getting louder and louder and louder...

If you're disappointed that the movie's "secret" is out — that the film is not a documentary, and the three actors are eagerly awaiting their next screen roles — don't let the knowledge keep you out of the theater. "The Blair Witch Project" is superb work and should not be missed.

One word of caution, however. If you are prone to motion sickness, bring along something to settle your stomach; the handheld video recording style of the movie might make you queasy.

to show is how it broadens the aspects of females."

She said there is definitely a feminist perspective in her work, but that more important to her is developing a cohesion among the differing aspects of human nature.

"My work speaks to both genders, seeking to link rather than separate us," she said.

Jessie Johnson of the Cultural Forum, who organized the month-long event, "discovered" Alba's work via the Internet, where the artist not only displays an on-line gallery but conducts weekly chat sessions with like-minded, often-artistic individuals about her work.

Alba has been featured in countless group and solo exhibitions during the last two decades throughout the United States. She has also lectured extensively on both artistic technique and representation.
