

# Groups rally to ease suffering

■ Student groups team up to raise funds for Taiwanese earthquake victims

When students from the Chinese Student Association and Taiwanese Student Organization heard about the earthquake in Taiwan, they decided to join hands with other Taiwanese students in town to hold a fund-raising lunch this Sunday at the EMU.

"I feel it's the responsibility of us, the lucky ones in the U.S., to help those who are suffering in our homeland," said Eric Yin, CSA program coordinator.

The Sept. 21 earthquake, which measured at magnitude 7.6, killed more than 2,200 people on the island.

People who live near the epicenter are still struggling without necessary amenities: electricity, water, natural gas and a sufficient food supply.

The fund-raiser will help raise money so earthquake victims can survive without these modern conveniences.

During the activity, students will serve Taiwanese food to the attendants and exhibit a slide show about the current living conditions in Taiwan.

The students will also hold an auction after the lunch to raise money. The auction will feature Chinese handicrafts including key chains marked with Chinese characters.

"I was there to see all the pain and suffering of these people," said David Tam, the president of the fund-raising event. Tam was

in Taiwan when the earthquake occurred.

"Coming back to the U.S., I want to help people at Taiwan as well as students of the University to cope with the tragedy happened. And this is the best way I can help," he said.

Besides the fund-raising activities this Sunday, the Taiwanese students set up "Taiwan Earthquake Relief Fund," an account at Bank of America to receive donations from the public.

All money received will be transferred directly to the Red Cross in Taiwan and redistributed.

As part of the fund-raiser, Taiwanese students will show video footage of the earthquake from a Taiwanese news organization, during an International Coffee Hour from 4 to 5 p.m. today at Taylor Lounge in the EMU.
