but approximately four years ago, the position was eliminated because it divided academic services and the academic community between three administrators, Williams said.

The new position is similar to the vice provost position, but it is one tier lower in rank and has fewer responsibilities.

The University does not need a vice president position to affect change on students' behalf, and an associate would be more accessible, Williams said.

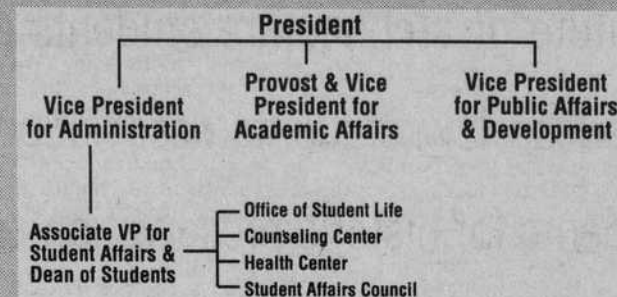
Jessica Billingslea, one of the 10 interns for the Summer Diversity Internship Program, which was charged with finding solutions to diversity on campus after the sit-in, also served on the committee.

Billingslea said that she, other interns and students in general wanted the University to conduct a national search for applicants and give the position greater responsibility she said.

"A national search would assure we have done everything to bring in the most diverse and best suited person for the posi-

tion," Billingslea said. "That doesn't mean we wouldn't end up with the same person, but at least we should have exhausted the possibilities."

There were two reasons the administration only conducted a University-wide search, Williams said. One: Williams was confident there were qualified candidates among the University administration. Two: Each university has a unique culture with which current administrators have knowledge, Williams

said.

Part of the new position will include a Student Affairs Council, which is designed to understand students' perspective.

Chen said student participation on that council is essential and one of the most beneficial aspects of the new position.

"If we don't have students on the student affairs council, how effective will it be?" Chen said.

It is still unclear whether students will participate on the committee.



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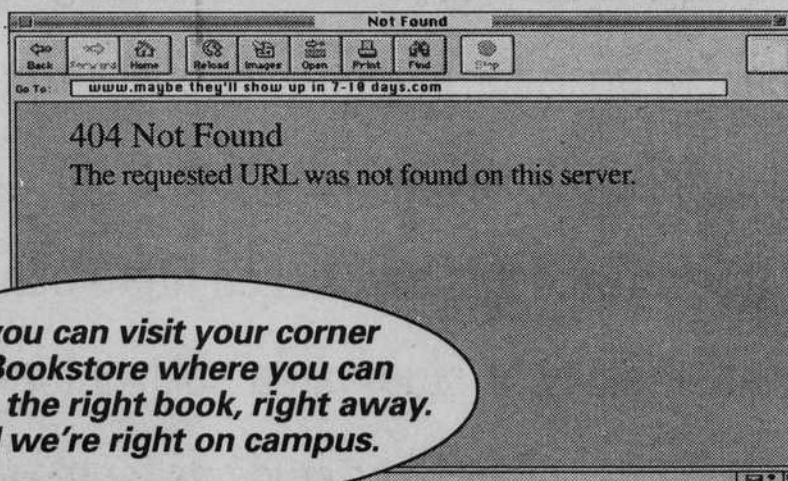
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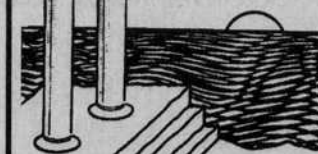
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
