Cal calling receivers

California played without its No. 1 running back in their 38-28 loss to Brigham Young last weekend.

Not that Marcus Fields, the conference's sixth-best rusher last season, wasn't playing. He was.

But he was there as a wide receiver.

The 6-foot-2, 215-pound junior may not have had any experience at receiver, but that's where he lined up against the Cougars. His debut was decent, as he caught three passes for 55 yards.

One reason for the switch was the emergence of freshman Joe Igber, who validated coach Tom Holmoe's decision by rushing for 116 yards.

The second reason: Cal's receivers need help.

The Bears rank last in passing offense and passing efficiency through five games, at 142 yards per game and a completion percentage of almost 42 percent.
