Pac-10 quarrels for bowl position

Southern California (3-4, 1-3) at California (3-4, 2-2)

While USC is no longer a dominating force in the Pacific-10 Conference, don't expect this game to be of any less importance for either team. Both are coming off close losses and are in must-win situations to keep bowl prospects alive.

California head coach Tom Holmoe understands the implications of his team's meeting with the Trojans.

"This is the state of California and there's a great tradition of rivalry," said Holmoe, in his third season with the Golden Bears. "There is no less significance because they're not at the top of the standings."

California should be short-handed. Holmoe said both wide receiver Michael Ainsworth and fullback Saleem Muhammad are "doubtful."

That is good news for USC's defense, which allowed Stanford to score 35 points last weekend, offsetting a career game by Trojan quarterback Mike Van Raaphorst. The junior from La Mesa, Calif., broke USC's single-game passing record with 415 yards.

Oregon State (4-3, 1-3) at Washington State (2-5, 1-3)

Wow, what happened in Beaver country?

Prior to Oregon State's 55-7 thrashing of UCLA, Beaver fans were no longer talking of the team's 3-0 start, having lost three straight in the Pac-10.

After last weekend, however, there is bowl talk in Corvallis once again, something Oregon State hasn't accomplished in 27 years.

"We're just taking it one win at a time," said head coach Dennis Erickson, who coached Washington State in 1987 and 1988. "A bowl is not something you think about when you're trying to get

win number five."

Oregon State needs the services of running back Ken Simonton in order to get that fifth win. Simonton, who leads the Pac-10 with 135 yards per game,



left the UCLA game in the first quarter with injured ribs. The first diagnosis was cracked ribs, but Erickson said they are

only bruised. Simonton is questionable for Saturday.

The Cougar defense is extra stingy in Pullman, Wash., and has the personnel to make it a long afternoon for Oregon State's offense. Linebacker Steve Gleason and free safety Billy Newman are first and third in the conference in tackles, respectively.

Arizona (5-3, 2-2) at UCLA (3-5, 1-4)

Last season, UCLA and Arizona met in Tucson, Ariz., with much more than pride on the line. Both teams sported undefeated records, so a Rose Bowl berth — as well as a possible national title — was at stake. The Bruins shocked Arizona 52-28. That win eventually landed them in the Rose Bowl.

This season, however, UCLA will be lucky to make the Las Vegas Bowl.

If the Wildcats get revenge against the Bruins, UCLA is out of the bowl picture. Last season's loss to UCLA — as well as Arizona's heartbreaking loss to Oregon last weekend — should be enough motivation for the Wildcats.

The Bruin's defense is young and vulnerable against an explosive team like the Wildcats. Arizona wide receiver Dennis Northcutt and running back Trung Canidate lead an offense that has blistered opponents for an average of more than 500 yards of total offense over the last four games.
