Man dies in logging accident near Cottage Grove

COTTAGE GROVE - One man was killed and another was injured Wednesday in a logging-related accident about 15 miles southeast of here.

Oregon State Police said Floyd Snodgrass, 39, and Joshua Larson, 26, had just finished their work when they were struck by logging debris. They both worked for Harvey's Logging Co. of Elkton.

Snodgrass, a choker setter from Springfield, died at the scene, police said.

Larson, a rigging setter from Coos Bay, was taken to McKenzie-Wilamette Hospital, where he was listed in fair condition with internal injuries, a nursing supervisor said Thursday.

The circumstances of the accident were not released, and there reportedly were no witnesses.
