Head coach Ernie Kent, who played at Harmon Gym in the '70s, was most impressed by the unity of its crowd.

"I just thought it was an incredible basketball environment," Kent said. "Not only is it a beautiful building, but the fact that they have organized their fans so quickly is impressive. They were color coordinated in all different sections, and were really synchronized with their chants."

But he still makes sure to let you know about his love for The

Pit.

"We've got a great environment that has been created here with the way this team plays and the way the community responds to it," Kent said. "It's been outstanding this year, and it should get even better as we come down the stretch."

**The Christoffersen watch**

One of the few bright spots in the Ducks 76-61 loss at Stanford last Thursday was little-used 7-foot-2 sophomore center Chris Christoffersen.

It was only Christoffersen's eighth appearance all year, and his first since the last time Oregon played the Cardinal — a span of six games.

Despite the rust, he still managed to contribute five points and three blocks in his nine minutes of play.

"He really played hard and

stepped up," Smith said. "He's played well in practice and I know coaches want to get him in the game. He's played his two best games against arguably the best team in the country, so that's a good sign."

So will Duck fans see Christoffersen this weekend?

"He has a tough time matching up with the Washington schools because they both have under-sized posts," Kent said. "So it's going to be tough for him to get much playing time."

**The NCAA watch**

ESPN's latest weekly NCAA Tourney projections now have Oregon as the No. 7 seed in the Midwest Region facing Miami in Minneapolis, Minn., on March 16. UCLA is picked in the same region at No. 12, while Stanford and Arizona are given No. 1 seeds in the West and South, respectively.

The sophomore has her own Web site on goducks.com, proclaiming her an All-America Candidate. The site points out "Shaquesqe" accolades such as leading the Ducks with 17.0 points and 4.3 assists per game and ranking third in both scoring and assists.

However, there are some things that the stats don't say.

Like the fact that many of

Williams' perimeter shots are not falling, and that her season field-goal percentage is 39.1 percent.

"If I'm not shooting well, I've still got to do a good job of running the basketball team," Williams said. "That means keeping everybody involved and doing things like that. Even though my shooting percentages are down, I'm trying to do other things."

Along with bench players stepping up their roles, at least one starter usually makes her presence heavily felt. Against Califor-

nia, it was senior Nicole Strange's 17 points. Against Arizona State, it was Williams, scoring 25 points.

But even to Williams, the depth is not all it's perceived to be.

"We're so inconsistent right now that our depth isn't really where it should be," the sophomore said. "If you knew who was going to show up every night consistently, then you could say we have great depth, but those same people aren't showing up every night."
