The Duck golfers end up 14th in Arizona

At least they're consistent.

The Oregon lady golfers finished in a tie for 14th place at the Arizona Wildcat Invitational in Tucson Wednesday despite a second-round effort that should have earned them a better spot.

The Ducks' team scores improved sharply Tuesday after a poor first round on Monday, but the players returned to high scores in the final round yesterday.

Every Oregon team member posted a third round score that was worse than their secondround effort.

Junior Jerilyn White led Oregon with a six-over par 222. White ended the tournament in a tie for 32nd place.

Senior Anika Heuser (10-over par 226) finished in 50th place. Seniors Pam Sowden and Angie Rizzo (11-over, 227) finished a stroke behind Heuser in a tie for 57th. Sophomore Julia Smith (31-over, 247) ended up 96th of 96 golfers.

Oregon has a month off before the Colby Santa Clara Invitational in Monterey, Calif. on March 20.


