Some students opt to personally select their roommate. They may sign up a close friend, or even an acquaintance from high school, even though it can be a little trying for new students to cohabitate with someone they've known since childhood, as they are often struggling to leave that life behind them at the same time.

Freshman Ian Taylor chose not to room with his best friend since grade school for this reason.

"It's better this way," he said. "We still hang out all the time, but we have our own space, too. This way we don't get completely sick of each other.'
