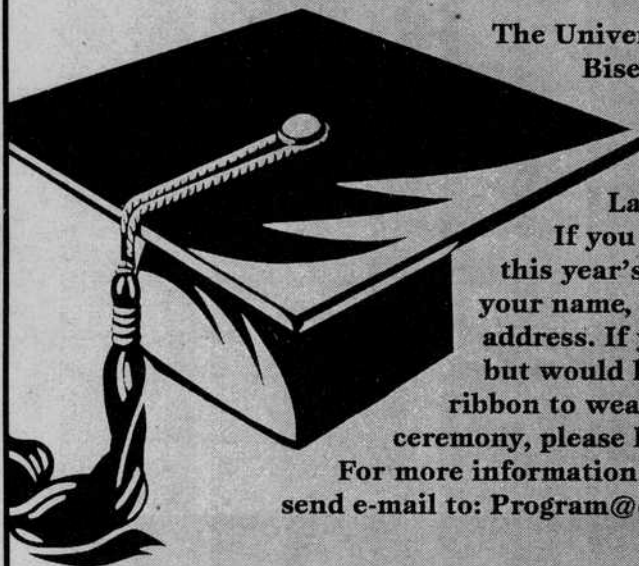

the par-72 course for a two-round total of 148. White is also the Ducks' only ranked player, at 77.

Senior Anika Heuser only faltered by a single stroke and now has Oregon's best score, a three-over par 147. The Wuppertal, Germany, native was the Ducks' top finisher at the NCAA West Regionals two weeks ago, and the second-best Oregon player at the Pacific-10 Conference Championships.

Also placing for the Ducks were seniors Pam Sowden (150) and Angie Rizzo (153). Sowden dropped from fifth to 26th after a second-round score that was six strokes higher than her first round.

The top individuals helped their teams improve in the second round of the Championships.

Arizona's Julia Kraschinski and Jenna Daniels, ranked 29th and second in the nation respectively, led the individual race in the second round. Kraschinski shot a five-under par 67 — the best round of the tournament so far — to take the lead over senior teammate Daniels by two strokes.

Duke's Beth Bauer trails the Wildcats by a stroke. Heuser is in 10th, and White holds down 17th.

Arizona is on a roll going into the final two rounds. The Wildcats won seven straight tournaments and trailed in the first round at the Pac-10 Championships and West Regionals before winning by 18 and five strokes.

Duke is also on a roll. Blue Devils won five tournaments leading up to the NAAs, including the

Atlantic Coast Conference Championships and the East Regionals.

There are also disappointments at the Championships. Fourth-ranked Arizona State, and its top-ranked freshman, Miriam Nagl, is nowhere to be found on the

leaderboard. The Sun Devils are 20th out of 24 teams, while Nagl is 26th overall despite a one-under par effort in Thursday's round.

Sixth-ranked Louisiana State, No. 7 Pepperdine and No. 11 New Mexico State are also playing catch-up. All three teams are 15th or worse.

According to Baumgartner, one factor in the Ducks' success at the Championships is the Crosswater Golf Course.

Crosswater is the longest course to ever host the women's NCAA Championships, playing at 6,482 yards. That's an average hole length of more than 360 yards. The Eugene Country Club, which hosted the Pac-10 Championships — where the Ducks finished seventh — is 5,557 yards long.

The golfers will play two more rounds at the NCAA Championships, one Friday and one Saturday.
