tions, also a local organization, are co-sponsoring the festivities.

"This is something that hasn't been done in the past," Joseph said. "Our main motivation is trying to bring a fun day of music to Eugene at a nice site."

"A Day At Dexter Lake" is expected to draw between 1,000 and 2,000 people. The Wild Duck will provide a beer garden and also participate as a food vendor, along with Mike's Magic Mushroom Burger and Genesis Juice Co-op.

The event was originally scheduled for two days, but as a first-time event it wasn't approved for overnight camping permits.

"We're just doing it one day this year to build a relationship with the park service, so we can plan a weekend event for next year," Joseph said.

Unfortunately, as a result of cutting plans for a second day, local talent wasn't included.

"It worked out this way because the national bands set their touring schedule around us," Joseph said. "And they definitely

"We love playing at festivals, and we love playing in Oregon, so it will be a great combination," Drew Emmitt, lead vocalist and mandolin player of Leftover Salmon, said.
