

Trail Blazers trample Bulls

PORTLAND, Ore. — Arvydas Sabonis scored 16 of his season-high 23 points in the fourth quarter as the Portland Trail Blazers extended the Chicago Bulls' losing streak to 12 with a 92-81 victory Tuesday night.

Ron Mercer scored 22 despite the flu, and Elton Brand added 18 points and 12 rebounds for the Bulls, who started a five-game trip by falling to 2-21 on the road.

Steve Smith added 18 points to lead a surge by the Portland reserves in the final period. After an alley-oop dunk by Rasheed Wallace to start the fourth quarter and a jumper by Bonzi Wells, the bench players scored the next 23 points.

Sabonis had missed three straight games due to back spasms, and he picked up two fouls in his first four minutes. But with the Blazers struggling on offense, his teammates found him again and

again underneath.

Portland came back from eight points down in the third quarter to take a 59-57 lead entering the fourth. A jumper by Brand cut it to 67-66 with 8:03 left, but Sabonis made a reverse layup and got fouled.

A reverse layup by Brad Miller pulled Chicago within 78-74 with 5:07 left, but Sabonis responded with a jumper after a steal by Smith. Smith then drove for a layup and Sabonis scored from inside to make it a 10-point lead with 3:45 left.

Wallace, named a reserve to the West All-Star team earlier in the day, was held to 14 points, and coach Mike Dunleavy pulled him with 9:41 to play after he lost a ball out of bounds.

The Blazers got Sabonis back just in time. Earlier Tuesday, the team announced that Scottie Pippen had undergone surgery to remove a bone chip from his sore right elbow and would be out indefinitely.

Exactly five years earlier, on Jan.

30, 1996, Pippen had 28 points to lead the Bulls past Houston to seal a perfect 14-0 record in January. This season's Chicago team went 1-13 for the month.

Wallace opened the third quarter with a dunk, but the Blazers went the next 6:15 without a basket, recalling their brutal 58-point effort at Cleveland last week.

A reverse layup by Brand, followed by his fallaway jump shot and Mercer's fastbreak jumper, put the Bulls ahead 57-49, bringing boos from the Rose Garden crowd. Portland then closed the period with a 10-0 run, capped by Smith's layup off a rebound by Wells.

Portland's sloppy play made the game competitive from the start. The Blazers committed seven turnovers in the first 6 1/2 minutes of the next period, but Chicago could only outscore them 6-3. A 3-pointer by Hoiberg made it 35-34, but the Blazers went on a 10-2 run, all on long jumpers and free throws.

Golf brief

UO men's golf finishes ahead of 11 teams

Paced by junior Aaron Byers' tied-for-fifth-place individual finish, the Oregon men's golf team completed the Ping-Arizona Intercollegiate tournament Tuesday in ninth place.

The Ducks' three-round score of 22-over-par 874 placed them one stroke behind the host No. 10 Arizona Wildcats and one stroke

ahead of in-state rival Oregon State.

No. 16 Southern California extended its lead from Monday's play and captured the 20-team tournament with a 19-under-par 833 — 22 strokes ahead of second-place California. USC was led by Alex Kuyumjian, who captured the individual title with a 7-under-par 206.

The two-day tourney was held at The Raven at Sabino Springs in Tucson, Ariz., a 6,776 yard, par-71 course.

Ducks are again on top of the conference in attendance, bringing in 4,799 fans each game.

For the Jan. 13 game against Stanford, the Ducks attracted a Pac-10 season-high 7,602 people.

Statistically, Oregon is among

the Pac-10 leaders in most of the major categories.

The Ducks rank first in scoring defense (allowing 58.1 ppg), first in field-goal percentage (.467), first in field-goal percentage defense (.370) and first in three-point percentage defense (.278).

Oregon held UCLA to a season-best 22 percent Saturday, the worst shooting performance in the Pac-10 this year.
