hold their own," sophomore sprinter Lucretia Larkin said. "It's our responsibility to compete as best as we can on that day."

Once again, the two teams should match up well Saturday. The Ducks should own most of the field events, while Washington will make up ground in the sprints. The meet could be decided in the hurdles and middle-to-long distance races, where the two teams are evenly matched.

"The event winners will be fairly easy to predict," Heinonen said. "What happens behind them, though, will be what decides the meet. It's likely to be really close."

The Ducks may as well tally their points in a few events before the meet even starts. No Washington athletes can touch Mary Etter's 168-foot throw in the discus, Maureen Morrison's 177-foot throw in the hammer, Jenny Brogdon and Rachael Kriz's 5-7 high jumps, Niki Reed's 12-11 1/2 pole vault or Sarah Malone's 165-11 javelin toss.

On the flip side, Washington has Jamara Smith's 100-meter time of 12.07 seconds, Chelsie Pentz's

55.47 in the 400, Anna Aoki's 4:35 in the 1,500 and the 4x100 relay time of 46:56.

The races to watch include the 800 meters, where Oregon's Eri MacDonald and Annette Mosey should lock horns with Washington's Nicole Robinson. The 100 hurdles should be close, with exciting Oregon freshman Ann Sullivan going toe-to-toe with Washington junior Kelsey Sheppard. The triple jump and long jump could also be nail-biters, with Oregon's Deborah Lee and Amanda Brown trying to

jump farther than Washington's Brittny Roberts and Zee Ogarro, respectively.

"We're all out there to do our best," Brown said. "If we all go out there and do our best on that particular day, we'll exceed what Washington is doing."

The first event of Saturday's meet is the women's javelin, starting at noon. A ticket to Saturday's meet will also get you into the softball doubleheader against Oregon State at Howe Field.

said. "We're solid pretty much across the board. No one is being held out."

While the Ducks look to dominate the field events, led by NCAA qualifiers John Stiegeler and John Bello in the throws, Washington is equally dominant in the sprinting events. Olympic qualifier and football player Ja'Warren Hooker is the favorite to win the 100 and 200 meters for the Huskies, as well as anchoring both relay teams.

Several factors could tip the scales in Oregon's favor. Redshirt freshman Jason Hartmann, an automatic NCAA qualifier in the 10,000 meters, is entered in the 1,500 and 3,000 meters, not his usual events.

Junior Santiago Lorenzo, who is relieved of decathlete duties this weekend, will compete in the 400-meter hurdles, where he has no mark this season. Washington's Brad Goodrich is the favorite to win the hurdle event, although Lorenzo has a faster career best.

Wins by either Hartmann or Lorenzo could propel the Ducks to victory.

Hooker and the Huskies are favored to sweep the 100 meters, but watch out for Duck football players/sprinters Wes Mallard and A.K. Keyes, who are taking a break from spring football drills for a speed test. Last season, football players Ric Cottengim and Samie Parker shocked many with sub-11 second performances in the 100 meters.

Two young and unproven distance squads will square off in the 3,000 meters and steeplechase. Ore-
