mph winds didn't prevent the offense from having its moments as well.

Without a doubt, the highlight of the game came at the 1:36 mark of the second quarter when Fife appeared to have been intercepted by cornerback Jason Jenkins. Both Jenkins and receiver Keith Allen went up for the pass, with Jenkins seemingly having control of it while falling down. But the ball popped loose, Allen scooped it up and completed a crowd-pleasing 72-yard touchdown pass.

"I threw it to Keith and saw it bounce off his hands, and from then on I don't know what happened," said Fife, who completed 16 of 27 passes for 273 yards and three touchdowns. "And the next thing I know, Keith's running down

scoring a touchdown. I still have to talk to him about that and make sure I know what went on there."

Joey Harrington (3 of 5 for 51 yards) only played the first two series, capped by a three-yard touchdown run by Maurice Morris to give the Green team the early 7-0 lead.

Two other Oregon tailbacks reached the end zone as Allan Amundson raced in for a 55-yard scoring run and sophomore Kenny Washington scored on a 50-yard scurry.

"This was a fun game environment up here," Amundson said. "I even had some butterflies, which I never have for just a scrimmage."

Hyped transfer tailback Onterio Smith, as well as offensive lineman Jim Adams, didn't play due to academic reasons.

The Green team also converted touchdown passes to

tight end George Wrihster for 23 yards and receiver Paris Warren for 70 yards, as well as a 36-yard field goal by Navid Niakan to take a 45-0 lead.

But the White, who lost last year 31-0, wouldn't be denied and finally scored with 4:20 to play in the game when quarterback Scott Vossmeier tossed a 40-yard touchdown pass to receiver Joey McCollum for the final 45-6 margin.

All in all, Bellotti was "pleased with both sides of the ball," but he was even more happy with the lack of injuries. The only one to report was receiver/punter Gary Daniels of his knee, but Bellotti said he believed it to be a tear in the medial collateral ligament as opposed to the more serious tear of the anterior cruciate ligament.

The game marked the conclusion of Oregon's practices until fall camp begins in mid-August.

ready up by three touchdowns. Fife launched a bomb to redshirt freshman Keith Allen, who stole the ball from cornerback Jason Jenkins and ran the distance for a 72-yard score.

"I thought Jason Fife did a great job," Bellotti said. "Considering the wind and the way it swirled and the rain and everything else, I think he proved he can handle any elements that could be thrown at him. He demonstrated a lot of poise and he completed some passes that are very difficult to do in this type of weather."

"Fife had an awesome day," said tailback Allan Amundson, who also made the highlight reels with a 55-yard touchdown run. "He has a lot of energy and he's really quick, which is something you don't see a whole lot of in a quarterback. I'm really confident with him in there."

As the No. 3 quarterback last season — behind Harrington and recent NFL draft pick A.J. Feeley — Fife said he learned a lot behind the scenes and knew all eyes were on him when spring practices began April 2.

"Joey's been a great mentor for me, like A.J. was last year," Fife said. "It's a family thing. Now I'm trying to do the same for [freshman quarterbacks Chris Lombardo and Scott Vossmeier]. I think I had a good understanding of the system coming into spring camp."

"And I really feel comfortable going into the fall."

"Fife is a very good player," said Harrington, a pre-season Playboy All-American. "He has been preparing on the field and in the classroom and he's making better decisions now. I'm really happy for him today."

The 6-foot-4, 216-pound Fife threw for 100 yards on 9 of 11 passing in Oregon's third scrimmage of spring practices on April 19, a big rebound from a 4-for-12 performance, including three interceptions, in the team's second scrimmage.

"I've been pleased with his performance actually the entire spring," Bellotti said. "I'm very critical of him because obviously he's playing a very important position but I think he's taken some great steps."

"Coach sat me down and told me some things I needed to work on," Fife said. "And I think I've checked off everything on that list."
